

Grant Title: RESEARCH ON INTERVENTIONS FOR CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT (R01/R21/R34)

Grant Number: PA-07-437; PA-06-181; PAR-06-248

Area of Research: Research focused on conducting efficacy and effectiveness trials of child abuse and neglect interventions.

Release and Expiration: August 21, 2007 release; September 8, 2010 expiration.

Application Deadline: *R01-New:* February 5, June 5, and October 5 annually; *R21, R34-New:* February 16, June 16, and October 16 annually. *Resubmissions- R01:* March 5, July 5, and November 5 annually; *R21,R35:* March 16, July 16, and November 16 annually.

Amount: *R01:* Up to \$250,000 or over \$250,000 using the \$25,000 modules; *R21:* Direct costs of up to \$275,000 with no more than \$200,000 in direct costs allowed in any single year. *R34:* Typically up to \$100,000 per year.

Length of Support: *R01:* Up to 5 years; *R21:* Up to 2 years; *R34:* Up to 3 years.

Eligible Applicants: Institutions of Higher Education; Nonprofit or For-profit organizations; Public or Private Institutions; State, Federal, Domestic, and Foreign Institutions; Tribally controlled government, organizations, and Institutions of Higher Education; Hispanic-serving Institution; Historically Black Colleges and Universities; Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian Serving Institutions; and Regional Organizations.

Agency/ Department: NIH, ACF, CDC, SAMHSA; NIMH, NIAAA, NICHD, NIDA, NINDS, OBSSR, FIC, CB/ACF, NCIPC/CDC

Summary: The purpose of this funding opportunity is to encourage empirical research focused on conducting efficacy and effectiveness trials of child abuse and neglect interventions or research on understanding effective strategies to prevent child abuse and neglect (CAN), and on the amelioration of the biological and behavioral effects of CAN on its victims. Only projects proposing rigorous scientific research designs will be considered. An intervention is broadly defined as any action that assists in changing the biological and behavioral negative health effects of child abuse and neglect. Interventions may target individuals or group of individuals (e.g., dyad, family, community, or service systems). Of particular interest is the development of large scale trials designed to target either or both the victims or perpetrators of child abuse and neglect, including preventive interventions. A major goal of this FOA is to bring together multi-disciplinary and translational perspectives encompassing basic biomedical, behavioral and social science research in mental health, physical health, public health and prevention, alcohol and substance abuse, neurology, injury, trauma and child development, to advance our knowledge of child abuse and neglect.
