

Grant Title: BUILDING TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH IN INTEGRATIVE BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE (R01, R21, R24)

Grant Number: PA-07-155; PAR-06-357; PAR-06-355

Area of Research: Systematic translation of basic behavioral theory, methods, and findings into research designed to reduce the burden of mental illness and behavioral disorders.

Release and Expiration Dates: December 13, 2006 release; March 6, 2009 expiration.

Application Deadline: *R01-New:* February 5, June 5, October 5 annually; *Resubmissions:* March 5, July 5, November 5 annually; *R21-New:* February 16, June 16, October 16 annually; *Resubmissions:* March 16, July 16, November 16 annually; *AIDS Related:* May 1, September 1, January 2 annually.

Amount: *R01:* Typically under \$500,000 per year in direct costs; if request equals or exceeds \$500,000, prior approval is required; *R21:* Direct costs are limited to \$275,000 over an R21 two-year period, with no more than \$200,000 in direct costs allowed in any single year; *R24:* Direct costs of up to \$225,000 per year.

Length of Support: *R01:* Up to 5 years; *R21:* Up to 2 years; *R24:* Up to 3 years.

Eligible Applicants: Public/State controlled, or private institution of higher education; nonprofit and for profit organizations; small business; State government; U.S. Territory or Possession; Indian/Native American Tribal Governments and/or organization; foreign organizations; Hispanic-serving institution; historically Black colleges and universities; Tribally controlled colleges and universities; Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian serving institutions; regional organization; eligible agencies of the Federal government; faith-based or community based organizations.

Agency/ Department: NIH; NIMH, NIDA

Summary: This funding opportunity is intended to encourage the development of collaborative partnerships between scientists who study basic behavioral processes and those who study the etiology, diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of mental and behavioral disorders (including drug abuse and addiction) and the delivery of services to those suffering from those disorders. Research topics may include, but are not limited to: studies of cognitive, attention, and/or emotional processes in attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder; research regarding neurocognitive and emotional functioning related to severely disabling mental disorders or drug abuse, such as schizophrenia, bipolar illness, depression, and addiction; studies of cultural factors involved in the diagnosis, prevention, treatment, and delivery of services in mental disorders, including drug abuse and addiction; research regarding behavioral and neurodevelopmental factors in disorders characterized by impaired affiliative behavior and social functioning such as autism and schizophrenia; studies of decision making as it affects the behavior of patients and providers in mental health or drug abuse services settings.
